Squarespace - functional and required cookies

Squarespace uses some necessary cookies so visitors can navigate and use key features on your site. These cookies vary from site to site depending on the features it uses. For example, functional and required cookies help these features work:

Crumb	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prevents cross-site request forgery (CSRF)• Cookie• Session
RecentRedirect	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prevents redirect loops if a site has custom URL redirects. Redirect loops are bad for SEO.• Cookie• 30 minutes
siteUserCrumb	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Prevents cross-site request forgery (CSRF) for logged in site users• Cookie• Three years
squarespace-video-player-options	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remembers video player selected preferences (volume, playback speed, and quality) for videos uploaded directly to Squarespace• localStorage• Persistent
ss_cookieAllowed	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remembers if a visitor agreed to placing analytics cookies on their browser if a site is restricting the placement of cookies• Cookie• 30 days
ss_sd	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ensures that visitors on the Squarespace 5 platform remain authenticated during their sessions• Cookie• Session

Squarespace - Analytics cookies

Name	Duration	Purpose
_acloggedin	Two Years	Identifies unique visitors and tracks a visitor's sessions on a site
ss_cpvisit	Two Years	Identifies unique visitors and tracks a visitor's sessions on a site
ss_cvvisit	30 Minutes	Identifies unique visitors and tracks a visitor's sessions on a site
ss_cvr	Two Years	Identifies unique visitors and tracks a visitor's sessions on a site
ss_cvt	30 Minutes	Identifies unique visitors and tracks a visitor's sessions on a site

Google Analytics

Google Analytics uses a set of cookies to collect information and report site usage statistics without personally identifying individual visitors to Google. '_ga', the main cookie used by Google Analytics, enables a service to distinguish one visitor from another and lasts for 2 years. Any site that implements Google Analytics, including Google services, uses the '_ga' cookie. Each '_ga' cookie is unique to the specific property, so it cannot be used to track a given user or browser across unrelated websites.
